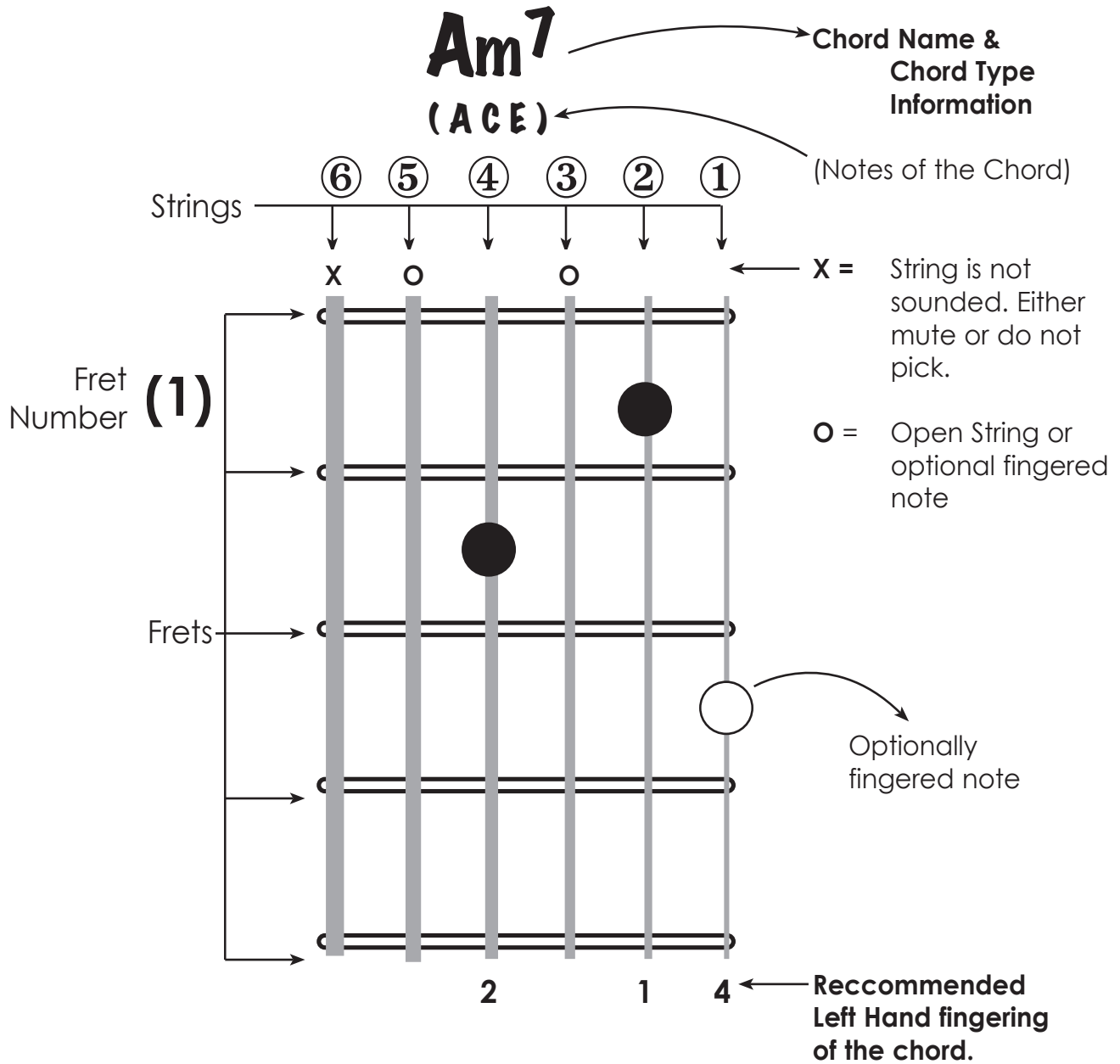

# The Advanced Guitar to Guitar Chords

## Basic "Open" Position Chords

These basic chords allow one you to play common chord progressions in Rock, Pop, Country and Folk styles. The most common keys for guitar are **E A D G** and **C**.
